Value oriented process is crucial for a school's all round development. Social and emotional intelligence of a child plays a very significant role in their healthy growth.

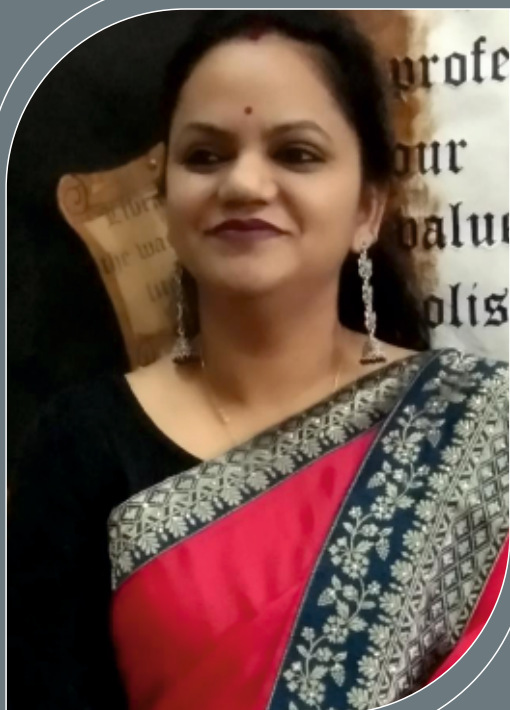

CALLIGRAPHY COMPETITION

The importance of good handwriting is much debated but the admiration it receives is beyond the purview of argument. To bring focus on beautiful handwriting English Department of Mody school organized an Inter-house English calligraphy competition on April 29, 2022. The students of grades - III to VIII wrote a given quote with a concerted focus on formation, size, space and general neatness.

To bring focus on poets, the Library Department of Mody School in tandem with the Department of English organised an Inter-house collage making competition for grades- VII and VIII on the theme 'Nature Poets'.

INTER HOUSE SPELLATHON CONTEST

The Learning a language is the foremost step in the life of a child as it helps to communicate with the world, and a school plays a vital role to train the child in this direction. The Competition, which was held on 8th July at Mody School, aimed at creating awareness of the possibilities of using varied words in oral and written expression. संस्कृत-हिंदी विभाग द्वारा शिक्षण-अधिगम के अंतर्गत विभिन्न कौशलों के विकास के माध्यम से भाषा साहित्य को सहज, सरल एवं बोधगम्य बनाने का अनवरत प्रयास किया गया। इन [बाचन, लेखन, श्रवण व पठन] विभिन्न कौशलों के माध्यम से निर्धारित विभागीय उद्देश्य की प्राप्ति हेतु जहाँ एक ओर दैनंदिनी पाठ योजनाओं में विभिन्न शिक्षण प्रविधियों को सम्मिलित किया गया, वहीं पाठ्यसहगामी कार्यकलापों के माध्यम से छात्राओं की सृजनात्मक क्षमता को विकसित करने का सफल प्रयास किया गया।

SESSION 2022-23

With the beginning of the session of 2022-23 on the 4th of April, the cycle of curricular and co-curricular activities began. For class XII lab experiments began. July brought CBSE results of X and XII. Result of XII & X-science was 100%. Rishika Prakash of class XII scored 99% overall. Result of maximum students of class XII was well above the average of 75%, the goal set for 2022; but, the others missed the target with a small margin. In August, after a demonstration of coaching classes of PCMB for the classes IX, X and XI & XII, students responded favourably to the need of science coaching. After the recommendation of students, SUPER 30 coaching was selected.

In September Mody school was invited by 'The Scindia School' to participate in 6th Science fest. Five delegates went to participate in fest. SNAKE – FACT FILE



India is a country of snake charmers but still myths abound where this graceful animal is concerned; the actual facts paint another picture altogether.

Snakes are elongated, legless, carnivorous reptile of the suborder Serpents. Like all Squamates, snakes are ectothermic, amniotes vertebrates covered in overlapping scales. There are almost 300+ species of snakes native to India but only four i) Cobras , ii) Common krait (*Bungarus caeruleus*), iii) Russell's viper (*Daboia russelii*), iv) Saw-scaled viper (*Echis carinatus*) BIG FOUR are responsible for majority of death in INDIA. Rajasthan has about 30+ species and 16 species were identified by me in Sikar District.

Snakes probably don't see colour and many are near- sighted, including the Vipers and all the burrowers. Tree snakes, rat snakes and King Cobra all have good vision and can see you coming from quite far away. Snakes can smell with their nostrils but they rely mainly on the combination of their sensitive tongue (which picks up the odors) and the JACOBSON'S Organ in the roof of the mouth (where the odors are "decoded"). The heat sensitive "PITS" between the nostril and the eye in Pit Vipers can detect temperature changes as slight as three thousands of a degree Centigrade (0.003°C). Pits are very helpful in finding warm-blooded rodents or birds or even a slightly warm frog or toad on a cold dark night.

Snakes can actually hear very low frequency sound in the 200 to 500Hz range. They have no ears or eardrums but low sounds that hit the side of the skull are transferred to the inner ear through the jaw muscle and ear bone. They cannot hear sounds like talking, music or gunshot. Snakes are sensitive to vibrations through the ground and in this way can feel you walking past.

Feeding- All snakes are strictly carnivorous, eating small animals including lizard, frogs, toads, other snakes, small mammals, birds, eggs, fish, snails or insects. Because snakes cannot bite or tear their food to pieces, they must swallow prey whole. The body size of a snake has a major influence on its eating habits. Smaller snakes start out feeding on smaller prey, juvenile Pythons might start out feeding on lizard or mice and graduate to small deer or antelope as an adult. The snake's jaw is a complex structure. Snakes have a very flexible lower jaw, the two halves of which are not rigidly attached, and numerous other joints in their skull, allowing them to open their mouths wide enough(180° angle)to swallow their prey whole, even if it is larger in diameter than the snake itself. Some snakes have a venomous bite, which they use to kill their prey before eating it and some non venomous snakes kill their prey by constriction.



SNAKE – FACT FILE



BREEDING- About 60 species or approximately 25% of INDIAN snakes are ovoviviparous, that is, the eggs develop internally and females bear live young. Live bears include the shield-tail snakes, sand boas, vine snakes, estuarine snakes, most sea snakes, most vipers and most pit vipers. All the rest of Indian snakes are egg layers. It is not clear which of these methods is more successful, but some like the Cobras, Pythons, the Checkered Kellback and the King Cobra stay with their eggs for the two months it takes them to hatch, providing safety for their clutch from predators. But in egg layers and live bears alike, parent snakes do not look after their young; baby snakes have to find their food and watch out for predators all on their own.

The male has paired sex organs called the Hemipenes. Each is referred to as a hemipenis. After arousing the female with jerks, butts and even bites, he inserts one everted hemipenis into the female's cloaca and copulation can last for hours. Gestation lasts between 30–50 days and size of a clutch of eggs or babies may vary from four to six and in case of smaller snakes like Indian Wolf snakes, to 20–26 in case of Cobras and to 40 or more in the case of a Python or Russel's Viper or King Cobra. Eggs are generally elongated and leathery and need high humidity and warm temperatures to develop. Snake eggs generally hatch in 60–70 days; the hatching time is largely dependent on the incubation temperature. Baby snakes must fend for themselves as soon as they hatch or are born; newborn venomous snakes have fully functional fangs and tiny venom glands and know how to use them. A baby Python or

Sand boa is an expert constrictor from day one.

SNAKE LAW IN INDIA- All snakes are protected under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972. None can be collected, kept, transported or exported without the relevant permits from the forest Department. The Wildlife Act has several orders of Protection. Schedule I being the highest with three species of snakes i) Indian Rock Python, ii) Reticulated Python and iii) Indian Egg Eater Snake.

The next order of protection is Schedule II, which includes the following

Indian Rat Snake, ii) Olive Keelback, iii) Cobras (Indian Cobra, Black Cobra, Monocled Cobra, Andaman cobra), iv) Russell's Viper, v) Checkered Keelback, vi) Dog faced water Snake and vii) King Cobra. The next order of protection is Schedule IV, which includes i) Red sand boa and ii) Indian Wolf snake. Offences involving Schedule I, II and IV snakes are punishable by one to six years in jail (Non-bailable crime) and fine of Rs. 25000 to 50000.

Dear students, snakes are our friends and an important link of our ecosystems. They are very attractive and colorful creatures of nature. I have saved 10000+ individuals of snakes, lizards, bats and birds as an independent wildlife conservator. My team "RAJASTHAN WILDLIFE & NATURE SOCIETY" has been working at Laxmangarh, Sikar District from past 12 years. So I request you all, do not kill them and save their life and help keep the diversity of wildlife alive.
